

First Fruits

“Now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the first fruits of them that slept.” We just observed this season of the year, and what a special time it is. But its real meaning for us continues beyond a weekend celebration. Understanding that Jesus is the “first fruit” helps us grasp it more fully.

The Feast of First Fruits was part of a larger experience which began with Passover on the 14th day of the first month. Passover celebrated the exodus from Egypt and pointed forward to the crucifixion of Jesus as the Passover lamb. In our lives, we are crucified and die with Christ and experience justification through the blood of the lamb.

Immediately following Passover, the Feast of Unleavened bread began on the 15th day of the month which in biblical time is sundown of the 14th day. This coincides with the burial of Jesus. In this seven-day feast they were to remove all leaven from their homes in a time of cleansing. In our experience, we are buried with Christ and are cleansed in sanctification to move toward being perfect as He is perfect.

During the seven-day Feast of Unleavened Bread, there was a seventh-day Sabbath. On the day after this Sabbath, was the Feast of First Fruits. In this celebration, a sheaf of the first fruits was brought as a praise offering for the early harvest and the greater harvest yet to come. This is the exact day, the first day of the week, when Jesus was resurrected from the dead- to become the first fruit of them that slept. In our spiritual journey with Christ, we likewise are raised up to walk in newness of life. We also look forward in faith to the greater resurrection yet to come when we will be raised up to sit with Christ in heavenly places.

Forty days later was the ascension of Christ which, interestingly, does not seem to have a correspondence in the Old Testament Feasts.

Finally, to complete the spring feasts, the Feast of Pentecost (or Feast of Weeks or Feast of Later First Fruits) was celebrated 10 days after the ascension. That makes it 50 days after the Feast of First Fruits. This feast was to celebrate the end of the early harvest and was also a time of anticipating the final harvest in the fall. As the disciples and others were gathered together for this observance, the Holy Spirit came upon them to complete Christ’s work in the initiation of the church. In our experience, the Holy Spirit is the earnest of our inheritance. He is the completion of the early harvest in our lives, but only a down payment of the greater which is yet to come when we will experience glorification, dwell fully in the presence of God, and see Him face to face.

As we continue into the summer season, may we live in newness of life, transformed by the work of Christ. May the indwelling presence of the Holy Spirit empower us to accomplish His will and take the good news of the Gospel to the world.

Ministers’ Week 2021

Amid the challenges of this year, Ministers’ Week was held Feb. 15-19. 125 church leaders and wives attended the week. HVAC Project
