"Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless his holy name! Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits." Thus opens Psalm 103. The psalmist continues by listing numerous ways in which God "daily loads us with benefits." The psalm concludes with these words, "Bless the Lord, O you his angels, you mighty ones who do his word, obeying the voice of his word! Bless the Lord, all his ministers, who do his will. Bless the Lord, all his works, in all places of his dominion. Bless the Lord, O my soul!"

The repetition of "Bless the Lord" in these verses is a end series of messages. His subtitle

poetic expression for emphasis. A similar use is "Holy, Holy, Holy..." This Hebrew word, barak, is used in 68 verses in the Psalms alone! Certainly, this is a privilege for God's people to respond with praise, honor, and worship!

These passages gave rise to the Jewish tradition of short, specific prayers throughout the day known

as brakha. By New Testament times this was one short line that began, "Blessed is He..." So, Jesus' blessing of the loaves and fishes may have been, "Blessed is He who bringeth forth bread from the earth." In the following centuries this was expanded to "Blessed are you, Lord our God, King of the universe..."

These short prayers of blessing were for almost any occasion or aspect of life. "Blessed is he who gives sight to the eyes." Blessed is he who is the true judge." Blessed is he who has given a pleasant smell to fruits." Blessed is he who waters the earth." "Blessed is he who does good to the undeserving." As one rabbi said, "There's a blessing for everything."

Building Improvements in the 2023-24 fiscal year included new carpet in the main hallway of the school. We replaced the last three HVAC units in the main building to complete that multi-year upgrade. Some apartment work was also done with a bathroom remodel and new carpet in apt. 1. Minisplits were added in two apartments that previously had electric heat and window A/C. Once again we are grateful for the donors who made this work possible! It is a constant work to keep the facilities in good repair and provide a comfortable environment for all who use them.


