## Anabaptist History Tour

The Netherlands, France, Switzerland, Germany

Most reading this are well aware of the 500th Anniversary of Anabaptism. Perhaps you, too, have read the books, done the Sunday School series, heard sermons, and had many discussions. Maybe you even had the opportunity to travel to Europe as 42 of us did in October with the SMBI Anabaptist History Study Tour. As this year of reflections comes to a close, here are a few more to add.

First, we do not build on the foundation of the Anabaptist forefathers or martyrs. Rather, like they, we build on the firm foundation of Jesus Christ. No other foundation will do. Many may claim the Anabaptist heritage but are far from actually following the teachings of Jesus.

Secondly, the Anabaptist movement was founded on taking the teaching of scripture seriously. But when any given teaching is taken in isolation, it can lead to heresy. Some claimed the kingdom theology and ended up with the disaster of Münster. Others read that we should become as babies and ran naked





through the streets of Amsterdam proclaiming prophetic "naked truth." A few radicals even burned their Bibles because they thought the Holy Spirit would teach them all things. We must be careful to keep the Scripture in its broader context when interpreting and apply it.

Third, influential leaders can be valuable to the vitality and direction of the church, but they can also be vulnerable collecting a following or even going off the rails. The Melchiorites, Münsterites, Zonists, Waterlanders, Lamists, Hutterites, Amish, and Mennonites all formed under the leadership of or have names attached to specific leaders. The significance of "influencers" continues. However, much more stability is found by keeping theology and biblical interpretation clearly in community context.

There is, of course, more that could be said, but what are YOU taking from the journey of these past months. If you are not a historian, you may be tired of the historical emphasis. If you are into the historical moment, perhaps you have gotten lost in the details. Whatever the case, the body of Christ persists, around the earth! Are you a "member of the body," and are you fully invested?

### Financial Update

Once again, we have opportunity to express our deep appreciation to the individuals, businesses, and churches who contributed financially in the past year. It is your support which makes it possible for the ministry of SMBI to continue. It seems small and inadequate, but we say a heartfelt, "THANK YOU!" Through you we continue to experience God's faithful provision.

The facilities are well-used with our regular terms, WATER, Ministers' Week, and Family Week. When available, churches and families also make good use of the facilities. The campus is a lively place year round with only 45-50 days each year that it is quiet!

Facilities projects were on the lighter side this last fiscal year with the main projects being new furniture for the ladies dorm and cooks apartments and a dorm renovation.

# Year End Opportunities

- ♦ Concrete has been poured for a 30' x 40'picnic pavilion by the ball field. This project has been funded by designated funds except about \$8,000.
- A major renovation is planned for the kitchen and dining room in Aug. 2026. Significant contributions of materials and labor have already been committed. Details are still developing but expected cash expenses are approximately \$100,000.
- The Student Aid Fund helps to provide discounts for pastors, teachers, those who have done voluntary service, or those with specific financial needs.


